Day 1: Arrive Indore & Local sightseeing

Arrive Ujjain Railway Station / Indore Airport. Pick up and proceed to check-into the hotel . after freshen-up proceed to visit Annapurna Temple and Khajrana Ganesh Temple, Kanch Mahal & back to the hotel. Overnight stay.

Meal Plan : Lunch, Dinner
Night Stay: Indore

Day 2: Indore –Omkareshwar-Maheshwar-Indore

After breakfast proceed to Omkareshwar (90 Kms. / 2 Hrs.) to visit Omkareshwar + Mamleshwar Temple (one of the Twelve Jyothirlingas, is the most famous and vanerated Shiva Temple). Later drive to Maheshwar (70 Kms. / 2hrs) visit famous Shri Raj Rajeshwar Temple and Ahalya Fort near Narmada River and later proceed to Indore (80 Kms. / 2 hrs).

Meal Plan : Breakfast , Lunch, Dinner
Night Stay: Indore

Day 3: Indore -Ujjain –Mahakaleshwar & Local visits

After breakfast check out from the hotel. Later proceed to Ujjain (60Kms / 2Hrs) Situated on the banks of the sacred river Shipra. Later visist, Mahakaleshwar Temple (one of the Twelve Jyotirlingas, is the most famous and vanerated Shiva Temple), Bade Ganeshji Ka Mandir, Sandeep Mahaamuni Ashram (Where Lord Krishna was educated with Balrama and Sudama from Maharshi Sandipani), Bhartrihari Caves, Mahakaleshwar Shaktipeeth, Kaal Bhairav Mandir (The Kal Bhairav Temple is popular for its alcohol consuming deity. Hundreds of devotees offer liquor as an offering to the deity, which the priest offers to it through a slit in the mouth) . Later Evening proceeds to Visit Mahakal Corridor (The corridor has around 200 statues ,108 Pillars and it is spread along the Rudra Sagar Lake



with a total of eight forms of Lord Shiva available for Mahakal Lok Darshana). Later Back to the Hotel and Overnight stay.

Meal Plan : Breakfast , Lunch, Dinner
Night Stay: Ujjain

Day 4: Ujjain- Indore Depart

After breakfast, check out from the hotel and proceed to Indore (60Kms/2 Hrs). In the afternoon, Drop at Indore Airport / Railway station.

PLACES COVERED

Maheshwar

Maheshwar is located 13 km east of National Highway 3 and 91 km from Indore, the commercial capital of the Madhya Pradesh. The town lies on the north bank of the Narmada River and was the capital of the 'Holkar' clan of the Maratha Confederacy till they acceded to the Union of India. The name Maheshwar comes from Mahesh, Lord Shiva, which means in Hindi abode of Lord Mahesh. Maheshwar town is built on the site of the ancient city of Somvanshya Shastrarjun Kshatriya, and was the capital of King Kartavirya Arjuna

Indore

Indore traces its roots to its 16th century founding as a trading hub between the Deccan and Delhi. The city and its surroundings came under Maratha Empire on 18 May 1724 after Maratha Peshwa Baji Rao I assumed the full control of Malwa. During the days of the British Raj, Indore State was a 19 Gun Salute (21 locally) princely state (a rare high rank) ruled by the Maratha Holkar dynasty, until they acceded to the Union of India. Indore served as the capital of the Madhya Bharat from 1950 until 1956. Indore's financial district, anchored by central Indore, functions as the financial capital of the Madhya Pradesh and is home to the Madhya Pradesh Stock Exchange, India's third oldest stock exchange. Indore's real estate market is among the most expensive in Central India.

Maheshwar

Maheshwar is a town, near Khargone city in Khargone district of Madhya Pradesh state, in central India. It is located on State Highway-38 (Khargone city-Barwaha- Bandheri Highway), 13.5 km east of National Highway 3 (Agra-Mumbai highway) and 91 km from Indore, the commercial capital of the state. The Town lies on the north bank of the Narmada River.

Ujjain

Also known as Ujjayini, Ujjain is an ancient city of Malwa in central India, on the eastern bank of the Kshipra River. In ancient times the city was called Ujjayini as mentioned in the Mahabharata epic. Ujjayini was the capital of the Avanti Kingdom, and has been the Prime Meridian for Hindus since the 4th century BCE. Ujjain is one of the seven sacred cities of the Hindus and one of the four sites that host the Kumbh Mela, a mass pilgrimage that attracts millions of Hindu pilgrims from around the country. It is also home to the Mahakaleshwar Jyotirlinga, Jyotirlinga shrines to the god Shiva. [Read less](#)

Omkareshwar

Omkareshwar is a Hindu temple dedicated to God Shiva, is one of the 12 revered Jyotirlinga shrines of Shiva. It is on an island called Mandhata in the Narmada River. The shape of the island is said to be like the Hindu symbol. There are two temples here, one to Omkareshwar and one to Amareshwar whose name means "Immortal lord" or "lord of the Immortals or Devas". As per Shiv Mahapurana, once Brahma and Vishnu had an argument in terms of supremacy. To examine them, Shiva pierced the three worlds as a huge endless pillar of light, the jyotirlinga. Mahakaleshwar Jyotirlinga is a Hindu temple dedicated to Shiva and is one of the twelve Jyotirlingas, shrines which are said to be the most sacred abodes of Shiva. It is located in the ancient city of Ujjain in the state of Madhya Pradesh, India. The temple is situated on the side of the holy river Shipra.
