<b>Day 1 (07:30 Hrs.): Delhi → Haridwar (205 km / 5 hrs.)</b>	
Board the vehicle from Hotel Southern, Karol Bagh, New Delhi and proceed to Haridwar. Afternoon check into the hotel. Post lunch, proceed to Har-Ki- Pauri, visit Mansa Devi Temple and enjoy evening Ganga Aarti. Later, return to hotel. Overnight stay.	
<b>Meals:</b> Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner	
<b>Night Stay:</b> Haridwar	
<b>Day 2 (07:00 Hrs.): Haridwar → Rishikesh → Barkot (Approx. 250 km / 7-8 hrs.)</b>	
After early breakfast, check out the hotel and proceed to Rishikesh (24 km). Visit Shivananda Ashram, Ram Jhoola, Swarg Ashram, Geeta Ashram, Janki Setu. Later proceed to Barkot via Vikasnagar. Arrive Barkot and check into the hotel. Overnight Stay at Barkot.	
<b>Meals:</b> Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner	
<b>Night Stay:</b> Barkot	
<b>Day 3 (05:00 Hrs.): Barkot → Yamunotri → Barkot</b>	
Early morning drive to Jankichatti (45 km / 2.5 hrs.). Arrive Janki Chatti and then start trek to Yamunotri Temple (6 km) by walk / pony / doli. Approx Rates Per Person (Both Ways): <b>Pony: ₹2500/-   Doli: ₹8000/-</b> (Rates subject to change as per local union.) Arrive at Yamunotri, and may take a Holy Bath in Yamuna River (Yamunotri is the Birthplace of River Yamuna). After the Holy Bath, proceed for Yamunotri Temple darshan. Later, return to Janki Chatti and drive back to Barkot. Overnight Stay at Barkot.

<b>Day 04 (13.00 hrs.): Barkot → Uttarkashi</b>	
Today after breakfast check out (10:00 hrs.) from the hotel and keep your luggage at reception. Leisure time till noon. Post Lunch, Proceed to Uttarkashi (100 Km. / 4 Hrs). Arrive at Uttarkashi, Check into hotel. Overnight stay.

<b>Day 5 (05.00 Hrs.): Uttarkashi → Gangotri → Uttarkashi</b>	
Departure to Gangotri (100 Km. / 5 hrs). Upon arrival at Gangotri, take a Holy Dip in the sacred Ganges, Perform Pooja and return to Uttarkashi. (Gangotri Yamunotri has an important role in the Yatra). Overnight stay.

<b>Day 6 (07.00 Hrs.): Uttarkashi → Rampur/Guptakashi (250 Km / 12 hrs.)</b>	
Post breakfast, check out the Hotel and proceed to Srinagar (150 km / 5.5hrs), have lunch and then drive to Rampur/Guptakashi (100 km / 4.5 hrs). Arrive Rampur/Guptakashi and check into your hotel. Overnight Stay.

<p><b>Day 7 (04.00 Hrs.): Kedarnath Temple Darshan</b>  <b>From Rampur</b> - Early in the morning, proceed to Sonprayag (4 km), <b>From Phata</b> - Proceed to Sonprayag (7-8 km) &amp; <b>From Guptkashi</b> - Proceed to Sonprayag (30 km). Followed by a Govt. Jeep transfer from Sonprayag to Gaurikund (5 km) on direct payment. Later, proceed to Kedarnath (17 km) by Pony / Doli / Walk. After Darshan &amp; Pooja at the temple, return to your hotel. Overnight Stay.  (Kedarnath Trek Charges: - Pony/Horse: ₹6500/- per person   <b>Doli: ₹11,000/-</b> per person).</p> <p><b>Note:</b> Pilgrims opting for helicopter services from the designated helipads (Sersi / Phata / Guptkashi) to Kedarnath and back are required to reach the respective helipad on their own.</p> <p><b>Meals:</b> Breakfast &amp; Dinner  <b>Night Stay:</b> Rampur/Guptakashi</p>
<p><b>Day 8 (08:00 Hrs.): Optional Visits</b>  After completing Kedarnath Darshan on Day 3, pilgrims may spend the day at leisure or choose to visit nearby sacred sites. Pilgrims can opt for an excursion to Triyuginarayan Temple, the divine wedding site of Lord Shiva and Goddess Parvati, known for its eternal Holy Fire or you may visit Ukhimath, the winter seat of Lord Kedarnath and Lord Madmaheshwar, where the deities are worshipped during the winter months. These visits are optional and can be arranged at their own cost. Lunch will be served at your respective hotel between 13.00 - 15.00 hrs.</p> <p><b>Meals:</b> Breakfast, Lunch &amp; Dinner  <b>Night Stay:</b> Rampur/Guptakashi</p>
<p><b>Day 9 (07:30 Hrs.): Rampur/ Guptkashi → Badrinath (220 km / 10 hrs.)</b>  After breakfast, check out the hotel and begin the scenic drive towards Badrinath, one of the most revered pilgrimage sites of the Chardham Yatra. The journey passes through picturesque Himalayan landscapes, charming villages, lush valley and river views along the Alaknanda River. Enroute lunch at Pipalkoti/Joshimath. Arrive at Badrinath, check into the hotel and relax for a while. Later in the evening, proceed to visit the Badrinath Temple for Darshan (if time permits) and witness the serene evening atmosphere near the temple area. Pilgrims may also take a Holy Dip at Tapt Kund, the natural hot spring located at the temple entrance. Return to the hotel for dinner. Overnight Stay.</p> <p><b>Meals:</b> Breakfast, Lunch &amp; Dinner  <b>Night Stay:</b> Badrinath</p>
<p><b>Day 10 (05.00 Hrs.): Badrinath → Mana Village → Rudraprayag (190 Km / 6 hrs.)</b>  Early in the morning, proceed for Badrinath Temple Darshan. After offering prayers, visit Brahma Kapal, located near the temple, where pilgrims may perform Pind Pradan / Shradh rituals in memory of their ancestors. This sacred site holds great significance for performing these rites as per Hindu tradition. After completing Darshan and rituals, return to the hotel for breakfast (upto 09.00 hrs.). Post breakfast, check out from the hotel and proceed to <b>Mana Village</b>, the last Indian village before the Indo-Tibet border. After lunch at Badrinath, begin the scenic drive towards Rudraprayag, passing through beautiful Himalayan valleys and river streams. Arrive at Rudraprayag, check into the hotel and relax. Overnight Stay.</p> <p><b>Meals:</b> Breakfast, Lunch &amp; Dinner  <b>Night Stay:</b> Rudraprayag</p>
<p><b>Day 11 (07.0 Hrs.): Rudraprayag → Delhi drop (340 Km / 10 hrs.)</b>  After breakfast, check out the hotel and proceed to visit the sacred Dhari Devi Temple, located on the banks of the Alaknanda River. This revered shrine is dedicated to Goddess Dhari Devi, believed to be the protector of the Char Dham region. Spend some peaceful time offering prayers and enjoying the divine surroundings. After the visit, continue the drive towards Delhi. Enroute, have your lunch at Haridwar. Arrive at Delhi (Hotel Southern, Karol Bagh) in the late evening. - Accommodation:** Badrinath has limited hotels due to a local construction ban. In peak season, accommodation may be provided at Pipalkoti/ Joshimath/ Pandukeshwar, if rooms are unavailable in Badrinath.
- Helicopter Tickets:** Managed only by IRCTC via their portal. Travel Agents or Tour Operators have no direct quota. We will try to book on your behalf, how ever because of a huge gap between demand and supply, sometimes we may not be able to reserve helicopter tickets. Southern Travels Pvt. Ltd. Or its associates do not take any responsibility of providing helicopter tickets and in such a situation tickets are **subject to availability. If not secured, an amount of ₹9,400 towards helicopter tickets will be refunded.**
- Alternative Option:** In case of non-availability of helicopter ticket, our tour guide will assist pilgrims to reach Kedarnath by Pony/ Doli/ by walk.

## **PLACES COVERED**

### **Haridwar**

Haridwar is one of India's most revered pilgrimage destinations and serves as the gateway to the sacred River Ganges. After descending from the Himalayas, the Ganga enters the plains for the first time at Haridwar, giving it the ancient name *Gangadwāra*. The city is one of the *Sapta Puri*—the seven holiest places in Hinduism—and attracts millions of devotees, especially during the Kumbh Mela. Spiritual highlights include Har Ki Pauri, where the mesmerizing Ganga Aarti takes place every evening, and the sacred Brahma Kund. Haridwar is known for its temples, ghats, yoga centres, and a serene spiritual atmosphere.

### **Rishikesh**

Rishikesh, popularly known as the “Yoga Capital of the World,” is a tranquil town located on the banks of the Ganges. Surrounded by hills and dotted with ancient temples and ashrams, it is one of the major gateways to the Char Dham Yatra. The iconic suspension bridges— Janki Setu and Ram Jhula—are major landmarks connecting the town's spiritual and cultural centres. Rishikesh is also famous for adventure activities such as river rafting, trekking, and camping, offering a perfect blend of spirituality and nature.

### **Barkot**

Barkot is a serene hill town located on the banks of the Yamuna River and serves as an important base for pilgrims visiting Yamunotri. Surrounded by lush apple orchards, terraced fields, and snow-clad mountains, Barkot offers a refreshing retreat for travellers. The town provides stunning views of Bandarpoonch Peak and is known for its pleasant climate, peaceful surroundings, and reliable accommodation options. It is an ideal stopover for those looking to relax before or after the Yamunotri trek.

### **Yamunotri**

Yamunotri is the sacred origin of the Yamuna River and one of the four holy sites of the Char Dham Yatra. Situated at an altitude of about 3,293 metres, the Yamunotri Temple is dedicated to Goddess Yamuna, who is worshipped as the symbol of purity and protection. The trek to Yamunotri, starting from Janki Chatti, passes through beautiful forests, waterfalls, and rugged mountain terrain. Pilgrims also visit the nearby thermal springs, especially Surya Kund, where offerings are cooked and presented to the deity. The magnificent backdrop of Himalayan peaks adds to the divine spiritual experience.

### **Uttarkashi**

Uttarkashi, often referred to as “Kashi of the North,” is a sacred town located on the banks of the Bhagirathi River. It is home to the ancient Vishwanath Temple, dedicated to Lord Shiva, and several significant ashrams and spiritual centres. The town is also known for its natural beauty, surrounded by dense forests, valleys, and snow-laden mountains. Uttarkashi serves as the gateway to many important treks and pilgrimage routes, including Gangotri. Its cultural heritage, mythological significance, and peaceful atmosphere make it a vital destination on the Char Dham circuit.

### **Gangotri**

Gangotri is one of the most revered pilgrimage sites in Hinduism and marks the origin of the holy River Ganga.

Located at an altitude of 3,100 metres, the Gangotri Temple—dedicated to Goddess Ganga—was built in the 18th century and stands amidst majestic snow-capped peaks. According to mythology, King Bhagirath’s deep penance brought the River Ganga down from heaven to earth to purify the souls of his ancestors. From nearby Gaumukh Glacier, the river begins its physical journey as the Bhagirathi River. The serene environment, gushing river, and spiritual energy make Gangotri an unforgettable and uplifting destination for pilgrims.

### **Guptkashi**

Guptkashi is a sacred town located on the route to Kedarnath and is renowned for the ancient Vishwanath Temple, dedicated to Lord Shiva. According to mythology, the Pandavas sought forgiveness from Lord Shiva here before their final ascent to the Himalayas. The town also houses the Ardhnarishwar Temple, symbolizing the unity of Shiva and Shakti. Set amidst lush greenery and snow-capped peaks, Guptkashi offers a serene atmosphere for devotees and travellers.

### **Rampur**

Rampur is a small, peaceful settlement typically used as a transit point for travellers moving towards higher Himalayan shrines. Surrounded by natural greenery, terraced fields, and mountain views, Rampur offers a refreshing break during long journeys. While not a major pilgrimage site, it provides a calm environment, local culture, and necessary travel conveniences.

### **Kedarnath**

Kedarnath, one of the twelve Jyotirlingas of Lord Shiva, is among the most significant pilgrimage sites in India. Situated at an altitude of 3,583 metres in the majestic Garhwal Himalayas, it can be reached only by an uphill trek or helicopter service. The Kedarnath Temple, believed to be built by the Pandavas and revived by Adi Shankaracharya, stands as a symbol of unwavering faith and devotion. Surrounded by towering snow-covered peaks, glaciers, and pristine natural beauty, Kedarnath offers a divine and unforgettable spiritual experience.

### **Triyuginarayan**

Triyuginarayan is a sacred village known as the divine wedding place of Lord Shiva and Goddess Parvati. The eternal flame that witnessed their marriage—called *Akhand Dhuni*—still burns in the temple courtyard, making it a deeply auspicious spot for devotees. Located near Sonprayag, the village offers breathtaking Himalayan views and holds immense significance for couples seeking marital blessings.

### **Ukhimath**

Ukhimath is the winter seat of Lord Kedarnath and Madhyamaheshwar, where their idols are worshipped when snow blocks access to the higher Himalayan shrines. Nestled amid dense forests and stunning mountain views, Ukhimath is also home to several ancient temples dedicated to Lord Shiva, Goddess Parvati, and other deities. The town offers a peaceful environment and serves as an important cultural and religious centre in the region.

### **Badrinath**

Badrinath, one of the Char Dham and Chota Char Dham pilgrimage sites, is dedicated to Lord Vishnu. Located between the Nar and Narayan mountain ranges at an altitude of 3,300 metres, the Badrinath Temple is renowned for its vibrant architecture and deep spiritual importance. Legend says Lord Vishnu meditated here for thousands of years, protected by Goddess Lakshmi in the form of a Badri tree. The area is also famous for its hot water springs (Tapt Kund), scenic riverbanks, and snow-laden peaks.

### **Mana Village**

Mana Village is the last inhabited village of India near the Indo-Tibet border and is located just a few kilometres from Badrinath. Rich in mythology, it features attractions like the *Vyas Gufa*, where sage Vyas is believed to have written the Mahabharata, and *Bheem Pul*, a massive stone bridge said to be placed by Bhima for Draupadi. The village offers serene Himalayan beauty, traditional mountain life, and historic charm.

### **Rudraprayag**

Rudraprayag is one of the sacred Panch Prayag (five confluences) in Uttarakhand, where the rivers Alaknanda and Mandakini meet. Named after Lord Shiva, the town holds immense spiritual importance for Char Dham pilgrims. Surrounded by lofty mountains and scenic valleys, Rudraprayag offers a peaceful stopover for travellers en route to Kedarnath and Badrinath. The tranquil environment and mythological significance make it a deeply spiritual destination.
